



IT'S THE 5TH ANNUAL "GREAT BIG SILVER LAKE BEACH BALL"

A male loon came to the lake on April 7th, he doesn't look like our last year's male. I saw him with a female on April 17th. I have heard a lot of middle of the night calling between two loons, but so far have not seen much daytime activity. Hopefully this pair has or will find a suitable nesting location. The high water level creates a challenge for them to find a place that is protected and quiet. Nesting should occur in mid-May with chicks by mid-June. Let's hope we have a successful brood this year!

WATER, WATER **EVERYWHERE!**

Once again Silver Lake, as well as all of the lakes in Michigan, has been blessed with an abundance of springtime water!



Then again, some

of you may say we've received too much of a blessing?

According to the U.S.Army Corps of Engineers, Lake Michigan has risen approximately three feet in the last three years. Now that is a lot of water!

Our drain remained open all winter. I've been in contact with Kevin McElyea, G.T. County Drain Commissioner frequently this spring. The spring runoff and early spring rains have contributed to a rise in the lake level. The lake drain outlet structure is located in a wetland area and the cattails, reeds and muskrats have been creating a lot of debris which can impede the flow of water and requires frequent cleaning of the

The lake level is receding, we just have to be patient. As of press time (May 16th) the lake level is at 862.28', as you read this it is hopefully at the 862' high water mark.

Enjoy your summer of water related fun and be sure to play safe!

ENVIRONMENTAL UPDATE

I have been in contact with Restorative Lake Sciences, L.L.C. (the company contracted to treat our lake for invasive species) to inquire as to when they will be here at Silver Lake to survey for Eurasian Milfoil locations to schedule for the 2016 spring treatment to contain its spread. The planned date for the survey will be June 16th with the treatment to take place later in that week. We will post this date on the SLIA website. The applicators will be posting notices on properties where the treatment is taking place, warning that the water in their area has been treated. If your property has one of these warning cards posted, please refrain from entering the water for 24 hours and do not water your lawns for at least 72 hours after the application if you are using lake water for your irrigation.

There are also other invasive plants, as well as mussels and fish that have entered other lakes in Michigan. They then have found their way into our lake as hitch hikers on or in boats from neighboring areas. Always make sure your boar is clean and bait wells are empty prior to launching into Silver Lake. Advise your friends to do likewise if they are bringing their watercraft to our lake. As we have sadly learned from the zebra mussels and the Eurasian Milfoil, it only takes one moment to create a problem that cannot be eradicated, only controlled at great expense!

Lastly, please make sure to get your septic tanks cleaned and inspected, let's keep Silver Lake clean and beautiful!

Dear Butterfly Lover,

After researching your question - I would advise that you not plant Milkweed near Silver Lake; it has an invasive underground root system, plus the ripened seed pods would be spread by the winds and as the result of hungry birds dinner excretions, sigh... This could threaten Silver Lake much as the invasive Eurasian Milfoil and Purple Loosestrife have.

Although Milkweed is undeniably their favorite, a Butterfly garden could include a number of nectar plants, including coneflowers, lilacs, sage, daisies, astors, marigolds, sunflowers, zinnias, snapdragons, (thank you Google!)

WALLEYE PLANTING **UPDATE**

Last fall we reported that the DNR had planted a hatchery crop overage of Walleye Fry in Silver Lake in the spring, 2015 and had scheduled a planting of 30,000 Fingerlings for this spring, 2016. This did not happen for whatever reason.

They have at this point scheduled a Walleye planting and a survey for spring, 2017, we will continue to monitor.
