Cook's Corner

When you get your berries home this year, prepare a mixture of one part vinegar (white or apple cider) to 10 parts water. Dump the berries into the mixture, swirl around and drain. Rinse if you want, although it's not necessary. Pop them in the fridge and enjoy raspberries for a week or more, and strawberries almost 2 weeks without getting moldy and soft. The vinegar kills any mold spores and bacteria that might be on the fruit. 0293

WHICH WAY DOES YOUR BOAT GO?

Michigan law says you must park it by one hour before sunset. Keep it at least 150 feet behind any other vessel. So, no getting too close to "jump" the wake. Reckless operation will be ticketed. Remember, cell phones take great pictures and movies of offenders.

DO YOU SWIM???

Please, please, please don't swim in the middle of the lake!!! Swim parallel to shore or with someone in a boat beside you. It can be very difficult for a fast boat to see a swimmer in a place they don't expect to see them. Talk about an ugly scene......
